While the rest of the world caught up with some of us who created virtually pre-pandemic, we extended our internal practices externally by shifting our venues to virtual audiences. We gave some artists the space to focus on themselves or their outside work for part or the rest of the year for community wellness. For those who wanted to continue, we figured out with our collaborators how to refine our approaches to be able to create work from our homes or distanced in theatres. We were then booked and busy! I was thrilled to have artists grow into certain roles and take the lead on projects to highlight various leadership styles within ADB. We collaborated with exciting communities nationally and internationally to have conversations and learn from each other how we can better improve our intersectional equity practices. While there were a lot of hardships that should not be diminished, we still managed to find ways to have difficult conversations of always ensuring everyone is equitably in virtual spaces while also providing moments of artistic relief from the intense realities we're in. In February 2021, we already have one international production and several panels and lectures with many more ahead of us. We will take these moments of reflection and resilience with us as we continue to heal together from this pandemic and the systemic inequities we face.

Performing Company

Our performing company consists of diverse artists within and outside of the disabled community that create work for professional productions. In 2020, our company was seen at the MFA for MLK Day, our 2020 self-produced annual production "Cultivate" at the Multicultural Arts Center in Cambridge, Cambridge River Arts Stream Festival, and a debut Celebrity Series Production at the Wimberly Theatre.

Community Engagement

Our community engagement consists of movement workshops and/or lectures on disability culture, intersectionality, and more to various ages and communities. In 2020, Louisa Mann and Peter Trojic taught Girl Scout workshops virtually. Louisa Mann also ran a two-month Creative Movement program at the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at UMass Boston for mature learners. Patterson was a keynote speaker for the Berklee Able Conference and equity training hosted by Yancey Consulting. She also created a "storytelling through movement" activity in collaboration with the ICA for 500 East Boston residents that would be later expanded to over a thousand BPS students in February 2021 vacation week. Other community engagements include Northeastern, European Association of Service Providers for Persons with Disabilities, ICA, Boston City Singers, Ipay, and Opulent Mobility.



Performing Company

- March, 2020: Cultivate production at Cambridge Multicultural Arts Center right before we shut down
 - Our female and nonbinary choreographers created work inspired by a variety of movement themes and musical genres. Those that did not feel comfortable coming were sent a video link so they could still view the work.
- October, 2020: Celebrity Series of Boston production at the Wimberly Theatre We restaged some pieces and premiered "Parallel" for a live streamed virtual audience.

Community Engagement

- Our Space Our Place: Performed a piece in our Cultivate production and started virtual work under their new instructor Kylie Sorenson to create a piece for our January 2021 piece
- International Collaborations:
 - Ellice Patterson spoke on a panel in October 2020 at the European Association of Service Providers for Persons with Disabilities
 - Patterson gave a lecture in Summer 2020 for the University of Peradeniya's Arts and Disability course that later led to a months long collaboration and virtual production premiering January, 2021




